Tees-Swale high nature value farming best practice award nomination form:

We want to recognise farmers and land managers who have continually managed important habitats (for example, upland hay meadows) and species (curlew and other waders) on their farm and who have integrated sensitive high nature value farming methods into their farming business to conserve and enhance these areas. Nominees should demonstrate the features present on the holding as well as how the sensitive management of these has been integrated into the farming business over a sustained period of time.

There is a total maximum of 2,000 words for the nomination. Up to five photographs can be attached.

Conditions of entry: nominees agree to allowing on-farm judging and publicity if shortlisted.
